

The Kerulos Center Internship Registration



Welcome!

The Kerulos Center internships are rooted in the philosophy of *learning in service*: applying acquired knowledge to concrete, on-the-ground work to aid animals in need. There are two parts: (1) online coursework and (2) a practicum.

The coursework is administered online which permits asynchronous (self-paced) learning. Upon registration, you are issued a password to the Kerulos Learning Institute learning environment that provides you access to online lectures and study materials. Learner meetings with instructors are scheduled via skype or phone to discuss course and answer any related questions relating to the course. Your first meeting with instructor will go over the course structure and process and answer any questions that you might have. In addition to quizzes, there are two exams: a mid-course and final both of which must be passed successfully to proceed. During this time, you will work with the instructor to design your practicum – the site(s) and activities where course material is applied. Upon course completion and before advancing to the practicum, learners must complete all assignments and pass oral and written exams that cover lecture materials administered by our faculty.

After course completion, the learner participates in a hands-on practicum with one of our U.S. or international partners or an agreed upon project that reflects learning and serves learners goals (e.g., case study, sanctuary internship and project, research and publication). Practicum site and content selection are shaped by learner's interests and site needs. Learners are asked to develop a formal presentation and/or publication that serves as a companion to the hands-on work. Your instructor will mentor and advise you on this. A final report is required that summarizes your experience. A certificate of completion is awarded at practicum and report approval and completion. All aspects of the internship are directed at honing learner's comprehension and competence to serve Animals with rigor and integrity.

Internships are available for undergraduate and post-graduate students, professionals, and others interested in deepening their knowledge and understanding about other animal minds and experience. While there are no course prerequisites, we ask learners to fill out the attached form below and participate in a phone/skype interview prior to registration. This helps us assess and tailor individual internships with each learner goals, expectations, and capabilities. The material is rigorous and in-depth and requires a strong commitment to content and purpose of the internship. You are a voice for the Animals and an ambassador for their cause.
